SUBJECT: OCR Creative iMedia

Topic(s) to be covered

R082: Creating digital graphics

This piece of coursework was submitted in November so we should have the results back by end of January. Students will have the opportunity to improve on this piece of work and resubmit in the summer.

R081: Pre-production skills

This is an examined unit (worth 25%) and students will sit the exam this January. We will have the results by the end of March and students will have the opportunity to re-sit this in the summer if they wish.

R087: Creating interactive multimedia projects:

Students have been working on this piece of coursework last term. This term they will complete this so that marks can be sent to the exam board.

Assessment Procedures

Students will be graded on their coursework (R082), once completed. They will be given a mock every month on the examination unit (R081).

Grading for the course is:

- Pass - equivalent to grade 4 at GCSE
- Merit - equivalent to grade 5.5 at GCSE
- Distinction - equivalent to grade 7 at GCSE

During each Unit, students should also track their own performance and are encouraged to use the Assessment Objectives to monitor own progress whilst completing each task.

Enrichment opportunities:

The specification will involve many questions which are tailored to real-life and problem solving skills, therefore teaching methods will reflect this. Catch-up sessions provided after school for students to help and support their journey to success
