SUBJECT: Computing

Year: 9

Topic(s) to be covered:

CREATIVE DESIGN – Creative iMedia taster

The first lesson goes through the Acceptable Use Policy and ensures students create (or have) a strong password. Students will also learn how to send a respectful email to their peers and to teachers.

This is an example of one of the units that could be studied if doing Creative iMedia at Key Stage 4.

This unit will take the whole of this term to complete. Students will:

- Understand how digital graphics are used in the creative and digital media sector (colour, composition and symmetry) and whether they meet the purpose and the needs of the intended audience
- Understand client requirements and how to meet their needs
- Be able to plan the creation of digital graphics using visualization diagrams
- Create new digital graphics using a range of editing techniques on Adobe Photoshop (a DVD cover)

Review completed graphic against the client brief and whether fit for target audience and purpose.

Assessment Procedures:

How can you help?

You can help them by ensuring their homework is completed on time, supporting them with their written work, and encouraging them to research and then reduce and summarise information rather than copying from the internet.

Encourage them to read out their work to you and explain it in their own words to ensure that they understand it. Get them to check through their work and correct errors with spellings and presentation.
