SUBJECT: English

Year: 10

Topic(s) to be covered:

<u>Scheme of Learning One</u> *Literature: Conflict Poetry*

Students will study a selection of poems from the Power and Conflict anthology in preparation for their English Literature GCSE. As part of this, they will consider and comment on the writers' use of language, form and structure as well the historical, social, and cultural contexts of the texts. Students will learn how to compare poems in terms of methods and message.

Scheme of Learning Two

Language: Transactional Writing

Students will develop and build on their writing skills and complete a range of non-fiction writing tasks to prepare for their GCSE Language examination. Throughout the unit, pupils will have opportunities to write their own transactional pieces of writing and enhance their written communication accuracy ready for their mock examinations at the end of Year 10.

Assessment Procedures

For each of the schemes of learning, students will be assessed mid-way through and then formally at the end of each unit. These assessments will be exam-style questions/papers and will be marked using the new GCSE mark schemes.

These assessments are preparation for the end of year mock style assessments.

Homework guidance

Students will be set a variety of homework tasks linked to lessons as well as spellings. Students will be expected to spend between thirty minutes and an hour completing these tasks.
