SUBJECT: Philosophy

Year: 7

Topic(s) to be covered.

Sikhism

In this scheme of work, you will explore Sikhism. You will consider the origins and history of the religion in India and how it is practiced in Britain today. You will consider the challenges for British Sikhs in the 21st century. We will consider how religious people may view their responsibility towards others around them and their relationship with God. Concepts such as Sewa, the values of Langar and religious experience will be examined.

Assessment Procedures

1. Skills assessments which will focus on key Philosophical skills: debating, evaluating, analysing and interpretation of religious and non-religious texts.
2. Regular exit tickets at the end of lessons to ensure that students are on track.

End of year test to focus on all topics studied: Introduction to Philosophy, Moses, and Sikhism

Homework guidance

Each week students will receive at least one homework for which they will be expected to spend a minimum of 30 minutes completing. These will be a combination of written, research, Teams, investigative homework's.

Failure to complete homework will result in a 30 minute after school detention in which they will be expected to complete the homework
