SUBJECT: Philosophy

Year: 8

Crime and Punishment

In this scheme of work, you will explore the concept of crime and punishment. We will consider what might influence individuals to commit crime and the punishments they will receive if they decide to commit this. We will consider issues including capital punishment, the treatment of criminals and forgiveness.

Religious beliefs such as Christianity will be examined, and how they want to support criminals to change their lives.

Topic(s) to be covered.

Assessment Procedures

1. Skills assessments which will focus on key Philosophical skills: debating, evaluating, analysing and interpretation of religious and non-religious texts.

2. Regular exit tickets at the end of lessons to ensure that students are on track.

End of year test to focus on all topics studied: Introduction to Belief in action Gandhi, belief in action martin Luther king and the Life of Jesus.

Homework guidance

Each week students will receive at least one homework for which they will be expected to spend a minimum of 30 minutes completing. These will be a combination of written, research, Teams, investigative homework's.

Failure to complete homework will result in a 30 minute after school detention in which they will be expected to complete the homework
