SUBJECT: Music

Year: 9

# Topic(s) to be covered:

## Year 9 topics are designed to build on skills learnt in Year 7 and 8

- 1. Soundtracks- students will further develop their keyboard/instrumental, composing and listening and appraising skills.
- 2. What Makes a Good Song? Exploring Popular Songs and Musical Arrangements.

### **Assessment Procedures:**

- Interim assessment (theory) based on their understanding of Soundtracks exploring film Music.
- Find of Unit practical test assessments to include keyboard skills, composition skills, ensemble awareness and listening skills.
- End of unit test- What Makes a Good Song?

### Homework guidance:

Students will receive 1 homework per double lesson on each rotation and 1 fortnightly homework on the music curriculum pathway. These will be a combination of retrieval, knowledge, and research tasks. Failure to complete a homework task will result in a 25-minute detention.

### **Enrichment opportunities:**

During your child's time at Lode Heath School, your child will have the opportunities to work individually, in small or large groups and as part of a whole class during musical performances.

Your child will also have the option to take up a musical instrument of their choice. We currently have a wide range of visiting music teachers from the Solihull Music Service.
