How does this unit link to prior learning?		
<p>This year, we have covered a significant amount of the English Literature GCSE including Macbeth, A Christmas Carol and An Inspector Calls. The skills you have developed will be assessed as part of your year 10 mocks through the completion of a question on An Inspector Calls. We will also be using the skills you developed last half term to complete a full English Language paper 2.</p>		
What will you be learning about?		
<p>During this half term, we are going to assess both your English Language and English Literature skills as part of the year 10 mocks fortnight. This will then inform the CTG tasks we do as we prepare you for year 11.</p>		
We will develop our learning each week by focusing on:

Future Careers						
<p>Advertising copywriter; they decide the words used for print, TV, radio and online adverts (£20,000 to £80,000); there will be 1.4% more advertising copywriter jobs in 2028.</p> <p>Broadcast journalist; they research and present the news on TV, radio and the internet (£23,000 to £42,000); there will be 3.6% more broadcast journalist jobs in 2028.</p> <p>Crown prosecutor; they decide if there's enough evidence to take cases to court (£41,000 to £65,000); there will be 3.6% crown prosecutor jobs in 2028.</p> <p>Marketing manager; they plan how to promote products, services or brands and oversee all marketing activity (£30,000 to £65,000); there will be 3.6% marketing manager jobs in 2028.</p> <p>Speech and language therapist; they help people with speaking and communication problems (£31,000 to £55,00); there will be 2.8% more speech and language therapist jobs in 2028.</p> <p>For more future careers associated with English, scan the QR code:</p>
